

Q&A Waterborne Traffic Paint



Q. Are you selling waterborne traffic paint? A. Yes, we sell Franklin waterborne paint in 18.9L pails and in 208L drums.

Q. Does Franklin paint comply with the new low VOC regulations? A. Yes, all Franklin paint complies to the new environmental low VOC regulations in force since September 30, 2009.

Q. When is the deadline to switch to waterborne? As of September 30, 2012, it will be prohibited to use paint in which the VOC concentration exceeds 150g/L during the period beginning May 1st and ending on October 15th. All Franklin paint VOC levels are less than 150 g/L.

Q. I heard that waterborne paint does not work well with LineLazer equipment? A. Franklin paint is specifically designed to work with LineLazer equipment. Call us for a demo.

Q. Will I have to modify my equipment? A. Because Franklin paint is designed for small airless type equipment, few to no modifications will be required. We offer an evaluation service.

Q. Why should I change type of paint now if I have until 2012? A. Most DOT's, cities and contractors will be 100% waterborne in 2010.

Q. Is the waterborne paint as good as the solvent base? A. Yes.

Q. Should I expect to change my working habits? A. Yes, our specialists will be able to explain the necessary changes as well as the impact on your budget.

Q. Can I store waterborne paint outside? A. Not recommended.
